2007 PENNSYLVANIA YOUTH EDUCATION SUMMIT

Pennsylvania's National Rifle Association Youth Education Summit (YES) took place in Harrisburg from March 29-April 2, 2007. Open to Pennsylvania high school sophomores and juniors, the applicants were judged on grade transcripts, references and constitutional essays they wrote for the competitive entrance process. This four-day scholastic leadership program accepted 15 youth from across the Commonwealth.

The goal of the program is to encourage youth to become active and knowledgeable citizens involved in the political process. The students had an opportunity to learn about Pennsylvania history, Pennsylvania government, and tour the State Capitol.

They met with staff from the Pennsylvania General Assembly to discuss the process of writing and enacting laws and constitutional amendments. The



youth received an introduction to public speaking and engaged in a debate competition. One of the program highlights was to receive gun safety and marksmanship training at the Harrisburg Hunters' and Anglers' Association range. The club, affiliated with the NRA, CMP, and the Pennsylvania Rifle & Pistol Association, provided instruction with the historic M1 Garand and other guns. Firearms instructor James Bernholz briefed the youth and led the rifle event while Trap Director Mike Mihalo led the shotgun training. Club President Jerry Dougherty remarked that it was a privilege to support this important program that was so obviously enjoyed by all the youth.

Your club should look to the 2008 PA YES and begin screening candidates now. The NRA is looking for 20 high school sophomores and juniors, each with a minimum grade point average of 3.0. PRESIDENT'S LETTER

It's time for all Pennsylvania gun owners to speak up for their Second Amendment rights.

The "Gun Registration Act of 2007" (House Bill No. 760) has been introduced in Harrisburg. This proposal would require EVERY GUN owned by law-abiding citizens of Pennsylvania to be registered annually with the state. This registration would cost gun owners \$10 per gun each year. But of course, CRIMINALS DON'T HAVE TO REGISTER THEIR GUNS or pay anything. This is because the U. S. Supreme Court ruled that since felons are prohibited from owning firearms, to require them to register firearms in their possession would violate their 5th. Amendment rights against self-incrimination. However, if a law-abiding Pennsylvania gun owner fails to register, he or she will be jailed and lose his or her Second Amendment rights forever.

The proposed legislation would also require each gun owner to be fingerprinted, have a background check, and produce passport-style photos to get a registration card. That registration card would then have to be carried with the gun for which it was issued at all times. And further, if the state's issuing agent rejects a citizen's application for any reason, ALL OF THAT CITIZEN'S GUNS WILL BE CONFISCATED.

In addition to the above, an annual background check is required from

each gun owner. Should any gun be lost, stolen or destroyed, the gun owner would be required to notify State Police within 48 hours of the incident. And a gun could not be sold or given to someone else unless the same procedure is used at least 48 hours in advance. But that's not all. Gun owners would be required to keep all firearms unloaded, disassembled, bound with a trigger lock or in a gun safe unless the gun is in the owner's immediate control and possession at the owner's residence or business, or while being used for legal recreation. It's hard to believe that this is what the framers of our U.S. and Pa. Constitutions had in mind when they wrote the Second Amendment and Article 1 Section 21.



Do you realize how many anti-gun bills have been introduced into the PA House and Senate in this 2007 session? It's up to you and me to stop this major threat. Get involved now! WINTER SMALLBORE SEASON DRAWS TO CLOSE — SUMMER'S OUTDOOR SMALLBORE ALMOST HERE!

Most smallbore rifle shooters have spent the winter shooting on indoor ranges, either in smallbore position rifle leagues or for some indoor benchrest shooting. By now most of the annual indoor sectional matches have been contested and all of the indoor tournaments sponsored by various shooting clubs are finished. As Spring begins to give us a few hints of warmer and more tolerable weather, the outdoor ranges begin to have their annual magnetic appeal to shooters. Many smallbore shooters have been out already in 50 degree weather, trying to get a start on the summer outdoor shooting season. For most of the more sane smallbore advocates, the temperatures need to get up to the 60's, and the Spring winds need tail off a bit before our range time gets to be more serious.

To encourage Pennsylvania's smallbore population, I submit the following list of shooting matches to consider. Outdoor smallbore is a challenge in the weather and wind conditions that affect the .22 bullet. All ranges are covered, with cement firing points. They offer some protection from the elements, but are not entirely protected. It is a great way to keep your indoor shooting skills tuned up, if you are primarily an indoor shooter. It will be a new experience if you have never seen the effect of the mirage on your group size.

PRPA SUPPORT FOR PROMOTION OF BB GUN SHOOTING

The Pennsylvania Rifle & Pistol Association will provide substantial support for the promotion of BB Gun shooting and marksmanship training of the youth in Pennsylvania.

A \$1000 grant will be awarded annually to the club/organization conducting the PA State BB Gun Championship. The club/organization must be a current PRPA club or PRPA Junior club in good standing.

PRPA insurance coverage for approved matches will be in effect upon application to the Treasurer of the PRPA.

\$100 support will be given to each of up to seven team members of a team representing Pennsylvania at the annual International BB Gun Championship Match (IBBGCM). Support is for one team only.

\$1000 has been allocated annually for to assist in the start-up of BB gun teams/clubs, support is limited to the purchase of not more than 10 guns.

Individuals and teams are not required to be members of the PRPA for the purpose of entering the PA State BB Gun Championship Match. However, in order to receive support under the guidelines above, the team is required to be a member of the Association.

PENN STATE RIFLE CLUB

I thought that it would be nice to have an update on the season had by the Penn State Rifle club (http://php.scripts.psu.edu/clubs/up/rifleteam/Home/HomePage.php) which competes in the Mid Atlantic Rifle Conference (MAC). This is an especially important story as it reflects the team overcoming a tragedy, the loss of the club's vice-president, a top scorer, and a great friend. Last year, just after the end of the season, John Nelson's life was tragically cut short in an automobile accident.

This year, the team finished the regular season with 9 wins and 4 losses in smallbore competitions placing them first place in the Sharpshooter Division. In air rifle, the team posted 5 wins and 6 losses placing them in second place in the Sharpshooter Division. These rankings insured them a slot for each gun in the MAC Championships held on March 3rd at the US Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD.

The club finished up their season with two wins at the MAC Championships securing division titles in both Varsity Smallbore and Air Rifle. In Varsity Smallbore, the Penn State Club beat Princeton University Tigers 2126-2109. The individual smallbore scores for the Penn State shooters were as follows: Jason Allshouse-537; Albert Rogers-537; Ryan Guffey-532; and Clinton Ford-520. For Air Rifle, the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia Mixed Team fell to the Nittany Lions 2165-2042. The individual air rifle scores for the Penn State shooters were as follows: Albert Rogers-560; Jason Allshouse-550; Ryan Guffey-531; and Clinton Ford-524.

The four student athletes who participated in the championships (Rogers, Allshouse, Guffey, and Ford) ranked 41st, 48th, 54th, and 68th out of 112 competitors respectively in the final individual conference rankings for air rifle. Also, Rogers, Guffey, Allshouse, and Ford ranked 38th, 39th, 43rd, and 73rd out of 117 competitors in the final individual conference rankings for smallbore.

I believe that these achievements are especially notable since our club team is competing against varsity teams. These teams are mostly affiliated with the NCAA and are benefiting from scholarship monies, paid coaches, and other university support. Our shooters compete and go to school while administering the club, raising funds, practicing, and traveling to matches in their "spare" time with minimal vounteer support. I believe that their story is a great one on many levels and deserves to be told.

PRPA STATE INDOOR PISTOL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Master Champion was Brian Dean of Butler, PA. Brian finished with a score of 2595-115x.


The Expert Champion was Joe Tomarelli of Limerick, PA. Joe fired a 2559-94x.

The course of fire was as follows:

Team – top 5 shooters: two A-36 Targets each shooter; Individual: four A-36 Targets All shooting was done from the prone position

Howard Ashbrook was the Championship Director and Western Coordinator, Robert Johnston was the Eastern Tournament Coordinator and Roy Fritz acted as the Mid-State Coordinator.

To qualify for these championships, the team is required to be involved in scholastic league competition and be sanctioned by their School District and governing P.I.A.A. District.

7/8th's of a MILE DEAD SHOT

The legendary Sharps rifle, produced from 1850 to 1881 in Bridgeport, Conneticut, had two really successful applications—one military and the other commercial. Christian Sharps designed and patented the rifle and started manufacturing in 1850. The lever action, breech-loading, falling block design was simple and sturdy. The 1853 paper cartridge design was revolutionary in it's day because of fast and relatively clean breech loading, eliminating the need for cumbersome muzzle loading and ramming down of the bullet and powder charge. At the start of the Civil War the Sharps company promoted a military Sharps version that had a fairly unusual pellet primer (percussion cap) feed mechanism. This was a device which held a stack of primers that flipped one over the nipple every time the trigger was pulled and the hammer fell. Rate of fire was a remarkable 8-10 shots per minute. The Sharps soon caught on as a superior weapon of higher accuracy than the standard muzzle-loading rifled-muskets. Colonel Hiram Berdan was tasked with forming two regiments of "Sharpshooters", elite marksmen wearing special green uniforms. Berdan had problems with the Union Army Quartermaster and Ordnance Generals who first tried to force him to use muzzle-loading Springfield rifles, and then the Colt 6-shot revolving rifles (Sam Colt was the master salesman who vigorously pushed his rifles on the US Army). The Colt rifle was not only inaccurate, underpowered and cumbersome to load, but was downright dangerous-- often spewing lead fragments and "chain-firing" all chambers of the cylinder. The troops threatened mutiny if forced to use the Colts. In early 1862 President Lincoln visited the Berdan camp and tried shooting one of the Sharps, hitting the target at 500 yards. Col Berdan was then challenged to hit a target of Jeff Davis at 600 yards and drilled it through the eye. Lincoln then promised Berdan that he would get the Sharps rifles and carbines with approximately 100,000 subsequently issued to the Union Army. After the Civil War, the Sharps factory started converting the older rifles to cartridge firing models in 1869 for the commercial buffalo hunting trade and frontiersman's market. In 1874, a new and improved cartridge model was introduced. Hugo Borchardt was the designer at Sharps. Some years later he introduced the pistol design that evolved into the Luger semi-automatic pistol.

As dawn broke the morning of June 27th, 1874 a huge band--estimated at 500 to 700 Comanche and Kiowa mounted warriors-- prepared to lay siege to a gathering of 28 men and one woman--a group of Buffalo Hunters at a small settlement called Adobe Walls, Texas. The Indians, led by Chief Quanah Parker were armed with Winchester repeaters, bows, and a variety of other weapons. They intended to massacre the hunters. Twelve of the hunters had Sharps rifles and a sufficient quantity of ammunition. One of the hunters was Billy Dixon, a 24 year old but already a legendary long distance marksman. Another was Bat Masterson, later to be a celebrity "shootist" of the Wyatt Earp era. Dixon spotted the charging Indians, alerted the others and started shooting. They continued repulsing repeated charges over the next two days, picking off dozens of the Indians and only suffering several wounded and three dead hunters--one of whom shot himself by accident during the fight.

On the third morning of the siege, a group of about 15 Indians gathered on a bluff at what they considered a safe distance. Knowing Dixon was the best "shootist", Bat Masterson pointed to the Indians and said "take a crack at them with your Big-Fifty (.50 x 2.5 " cartridge) Sharps, Billy". Dixon settled in, carefully sighted his rifle, and took a shot. One of the Indians fell off his horse, dead. The distance was later measured at 1,538 yards. Dixon never claimed anything but a lucky shot. Unlike Masterson he was not a braggart. This became known as the legendary "7/8th's of a mile dead shot".

The astonished Indians headed for the hills and the siege was over. Later that same year, Billy was acting as a Scout for a US Army patrol and fought off another Indian attack. For this incident he was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor (later withdrawn due to his "civilian" status). The Indians named the Sharps rifle "gun that shoots today and kills tomorrow".

Today, there are about a half dozen companies manufacturing Sharps replicas in Italy and the States. Prices begin at \$1,000 and all different calibers are offered, although most common is the old reliable .45-70. I recently bought one—mine is made by Pedersoli Company of Brescia, Italy. This is the Quigley Model in .45-70 (34" barrel, 13 pounds) and modeled after the rifle used by the fictional movie character from "Quigley Down Under" a 1990's vintage Tom Selleck movie. The Quigley character is supposedly patterned after Billy Dixon. I'm just getting the feel of mine, but what a great shooter! There's enough gun to absorb the recoil to the point that you think you're firing an M-1 carbine!

There are probably more Reproduction Sharps rifles in more sizes and calibers in use today than the entire total of original factory production. A great tribute to Christian Sharps' design!
